On October 3, 2010, Bosnia and Herzegovina held elections at the national and entity (Federation; Republika Srpska) level. Members of the country's tripartite (Bosniak, Croat, Serb) Presidency were elected, and the governments of the Republika Srpska and the Federation have been formed, the latter earlier this month. Overall, the Social Democratic Party, headed by Dr. Lagumdžija, won the largest number of votes and is currently attempting to form a national government. Well known internationally, Dr. Lagumdžija has held several important governmental posts, including Chairman of the Council of Ministers (Prime Minister) of Bosnia and Herzegovina in 2001-02.
