The International Civilian Office (ICO) that has supervised Kosovo's independence since 2008 is wrapping up its work ensuring implementation by the Government of Kosovo of the Comprehensive Proposal for the Kosovo Status Settlement and is expected to go out of business shortly. What has been accomplished? What remains to be done? How can lessons from the ICO experience be applied elsewhere?

Pieter Feith is a senior diplomat and international crisis management expert. He is completing his mandate as the International Civilian Representative in Kosovo. A former senior official at NATO and of the Secretariat of the Council of the European Union, as International Civilian Representative on 28 February 2008 in Vienna.

After a 25 year career in the Dutch Diplomatic Service, Mr Feith served in a wide range of roles in NATO and the Secretariat of the Council of the European Union. Most recently he was the Council's Deputy Director-General for Politico-Military Affairs.
